Crafting Compelling Eco-Stories: Best Practices for Primary School Teachers



Relatable Characters

Create characters that children can identify with, experiencing similar challenges.

Clear Environmental Message

Embed a strong pro-environmental message that resonates with the story.

Active Problem Solving

Show characters making positive changes, addressing environmental issues.

Optimistic Tone

End the story on a hopeful note, inspiring action and optimism.

Pre and Post Assessments

Evaluate student knowledge before and after the storytelling program.



Behavioral Observations

Observe changes in students' environmental behaviors in school and at home.



Student Feedback

Gather feedback from students on their experiences and learning outcomes.
